

Luck of the Irish
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Clue 2

For this clue, I chose to make another block for the overall quilt. So let's get right to it. Here is all the cutting, then we will show you how to put it together.

Colour 1 (purple paisley)	
<i>12-1/2" WOF strip</i>	<i>1</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles</i>	<i>16</i>
<i>8-1/2" WOF strip</i>	<i>1</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles</i>	<i>16</i>

Colour 2 (purple solid)	
<i>9-1/4" WOF strip</i>	<i>1</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 9-1/4" squares</i>	<i>4</i>

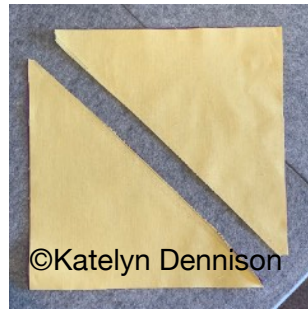
Colour 3 (yellow)	
<i>9-1/4" WOF strip</i>	<i>1</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 9-1/4" squares</i>	<i>4</i>

Set aside the 2-1/2" rectangles in both lengths, we will use those later in the clue. For now, let's use those 9-1/4" squares in Colour 2 and Colour 3. We will be making hourglass units that measure 8-1/2" before we add on to them.



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the lighter of the two colours and sew 1/4" away from that line on both sides. We will then cut on the line and flip them and sew them together again...after draw a second diagonal line.

Let's see that in pics!!



Now for that second drawn line and finishing these units...



Now we have hourglass units that should measure 8-1/2" squares and resemble these:



Now let's take those 2-1/2" strips and surround the hourglass like this for a 12-1/2" unit. That's all for today!!!



Today's finish:
