

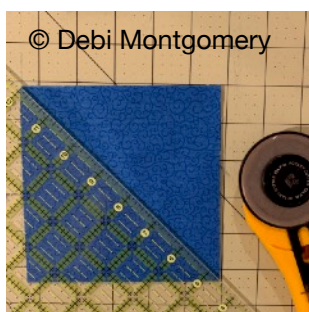
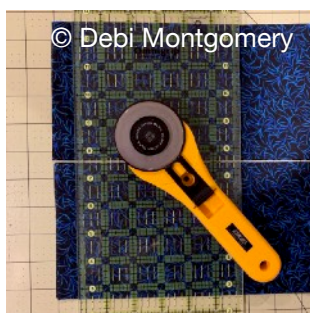
*Ke Aloha*  
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*Clue 1*

*For our first clue, we will be making square in a square in a square!! Our units today will measure 8-1/2" and be as accurate as possible. We need to add to this unit later...*

*Let's cut first.*

	<i>Lap</i>	<i>Twin</i>	<i>Queen</i>	<i>King</i>
<i>LIGHT 5-1/4" strips</i>	<i>1</i>	<i>1</i>	<i>2</i>	<i>3</i>
<i>-cut to 5-1/4" squares</i>	<i>4</i>	<i>7</i>	<i>12</i>	<i>17</i>
<i>-cut on BOTH diagonals for triangles</i>	<i>16</i>	<i>28</i>	<i>48</i>	<i>68</i>
<i>MEDIUM 4-7/8" strips</i>	<i>1</i>	<i>2</i>	<i>3</i>	<i>5</i>
<i>-cut to 4-7/8" squares</i>	<i>8</i>	<i>14</i>	<i>24</i>	<i>34</i>
<i>-cut on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>	<i>16</i>	<i>28</i>	<i>48</i>	<i>68</i>
<i>MEDIUM 4-1/2" strips</i>	<i>1</i>	<i>1</i>	<i>2</i>	<i>2</i>
<i>-cut to 4-1/2" squares</i>	<i>4</i>	<i>7</i>	<i>12</i>	<i>17</i>

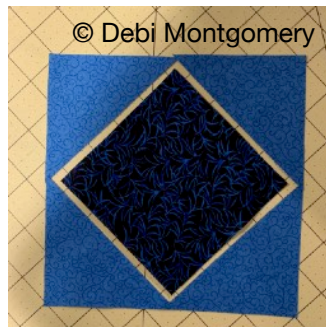
*I used the 4-7/8" scraps to make a couple 4-1/2" squares, you may be able to save some fabric if you can do that. Save these leftovers...we can use them in future clues. Diagonal cutting pictured here:*



*Step One:*

*Now to the sewing, take your MEDIUM 4-1/2" squares and finger press in half for the centre. We will take the LIGHT 5-1/4" triangle pieces and finger press those to find the centre as well. Aligning those creases, sew the triangle to the side of the square. I do two opposite sides first, press, then do the last two sides.*

*Deconstructed step one:*



*Step Two:*

*Once all four sides are sewn to the square, we will do exactly the same again with the MEDIUM 4-7/8" triangles. This time you won't need to finger press the square, you have your points as the centre marks.*

*Deconstructed step two:*



*Finished, but not yet trimmed:*



*This unit needs to measure 8-1/2" today. You will need to trim those triangle corners off and straighten your sides. An idea to keep your triangles from "stretching" would be to use starch to make your squares stiff before you cut them into your triangles. Also, let your sewing machine do it's job, DON'T STRETCH those triangles, lay them down and let them go!!*
