Clue 2

This week we are going to make some flying geese using some units we will cut today and the triangle units we created last week.



So, let's get cutting:

	<i>Lap</i>	<i>Twin</i>	<i>Queen</i>	<i>King</i>
<i>DARK 9-1/4" strips</i>	<i>4</i>	<i>5</i>	<i>7</i>	<i>8</i>
<i>-cut to 9-1/4" squares</i>	<i>13</i>	<i>18</i>	<i>25</i>	<i>32</i>
<i>-cut on BOTH diagonals</i>	<i>52</i>	<i>72</i>	<i>100</i>	<i>128</i>
<i>LIGHT 4-7/8" strips</i>	<i>4</i>	<i>9</i>	<i>7</i>	<i>8</i>
<i>-cut to 4-7/8" squares</i>	<i>26</i>	<i>36</i>	<i>50</i>	<i>64</i>
<i>-cut on ONE diagonal</i>	<i>52</i>	<i>72</i>	<i>100</i>	<i>128</i>

****Optional Cutting****

For the DARK triangles above, instead of cutting the squares you can use 4-1/2" strips and your QUARTER square ruler.

For the LIGHT triangles above, instead of cutting the squares you can use 4-1/2" strips and your HALF square ruler.

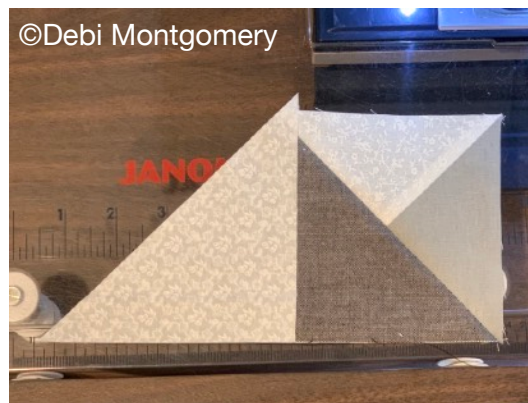
Now to the sewing. We will use the triangle units we sewed last week on the RIGHT side and the LIGHT triangles we cut above on the LEFT side to create these flying geese with the DARK centre.



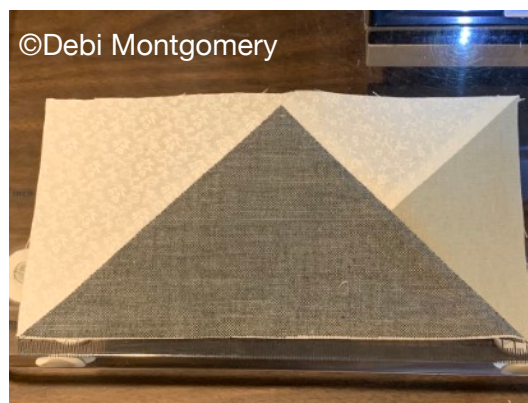
I sewed the two colour triangle on the RIGHT side first:



Then the solid triangle on the LEFT side:



I pressed these open because of the two colour triangle, but you can press away from the dark if you choose. Your choice here, it would probably lay flatter if you press the two colour triangle toward the dark centre, if you're up for doing that.



*Final size **today** should be 8-1/2" x 4-1/2"*
