 Clue 3

Now we will work with those strip-sets we cut and created in clue 1. We need to do a bit more cutting to complete our blocks. We need to make eight (8) of these, but we have cut enough to use the strip-sets again in a future clue, don't worry when you have heaps left over. Only one block design, so let's jump in and cut:

LIGHT	<i>All Sizes</i>
<i>2" WOF strips</i>	6
<i>Sub-cut to 11-1/4" strips</i>	8
<i>AND 12-1/2" strips</i>	8
MEDIUM	<i>All Sizes</i>
<i>2" WOF strips</i>	<i>Scraps or 1</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 2" squares</i>	8
POP	<i>All Sizes</i>
<i>2" WOF strips</i>	7
<i>Sub-cut to 2" squares</i>	8
<i>AND 3-1/2" lengths</i>	8
<i>AND 9-1/2" lengths</i>	8
<i>AND 11-1/4" lengths</i>	8

That's it for our blocks. That was some easy cutting. Let's grab those smallest units (2" squares) and the 3-1/2" POP lengths and make eight (8) 3-1/2" squares.



We need 32 of those Clue 1 strip-set units now. We will be assembling these into eight (8) 9-patch units.

Here is our completely deconstructed block:



Completed, I needed to trim the strips to square the unit. We should have eight (8) 12-1/2" blocks now.

Just like clue 2, this cornerstone cutting is optional. If you did NOT cut the lattice, please do NOT cut the cornerstones. If you did cut the lattice, you must cut the cornerstones. This is an optional addition to the design.

Cornerstone cutting: *OPTIONAL*

Sub-cut to 1-1/2" squares	56
