*We are well on our way with this amazing design. I can't wait to share this clue with you and we accomplish another set of amazing different blocks. The blocks for this clue will require some larger cuts, so save the remaining strips to cut down next time. We need fourteen (14) of these for this clue, so we are only doing this one. There will also be another border unit for those making the larger 15" size and want a border.*

*Let's jump right in!*

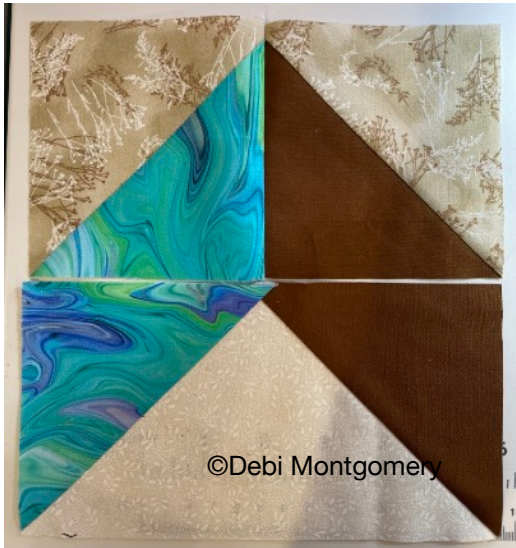
First, we will grab the 4" (4-5/8") squares (MEDIUM/LIGHT, MEDIUM, and DARK) and create some HSTs with them, drawing ONE diagonal line on the wrong side of our MEDIUM/LIGHT squares. We will only use 14 of the MEDIUM and DARK squares, leaving the rest to complete some flying geese units.

Grab those remaining MEDIUM and DARK 4" (4-5/8") squares and cut them on ONE diagonal. We will be making flying geese with the MEDIUM on the LEFT and the DARK on the RIGHT of the centre LIGHT triangle (7-1/4" {8-3/4"}).



Now we have three separate units to lay out like this:

First, let's stitch those HSTs to each other with the MEDIUM and DARK triangles touching, it should resemble a flying geese unit with the MEDIUM/LIGHT on the top corners.



We need to stitch these into a "chevron" now like this.



We should only have some pretty large triangles left to work with. Let's make some LARGE flying geese units with these, using the LIGHT triangles as the centre and the MEDIUM/LIGHT triangles on each side.



We are ready to lay out all fourteen (14) of these now. We will stitch the smaller chevrons side to side to make the bottom half of our units, using those large flying geese as the top. Each "half" should measure 6-1/2" x 12-1/2" (8" x 15-1/2") before assembly into our 12-1/2" (15-1/2" complete units.



Here we are complete:



**BORDER:**

<b>LIGHT</b> (Background)	<b>15" BORDER ONLY</b>
2-3/4" WOF strips	3-4
Sub-cut to 2-3/4" squares	44
<b>MEDIUM/LIGHT</b> <i>and</i> <b>MEDIUM</b>	<b>15" BORDER ONLY</b>
2-3/4" WOF strips	2 each fabric
Sub-cut to 2-3/4" squares	22 each fabric

We will be making HST with a LIGHT mated with each of the other fabrics. Our HSTs should measure 2-3/8" once complete and pressed. You will have to sliver trim these.
