 Clue 3

Block A for this clue brings us more straightforward blocks. Block B is easy, but does have some triangles in it. We don't have many more clues before we finish. This design is quick and easy! Can't wait to get started!

We will start these like clue 2 (exactly!) with MEDIUM and DARK squares and rectangles.

Then add those DARK and LIGHT larger squares to finish it off!!



Complete, these four blocks should measure 12-1/2", 15-1/2", or 18-1/2" and be pressed flat.

Using the MEDIUM and LIGHT squares that have -1/4", we will start by drawing one diagonal line on the wrong side of the MEDIUM fabric (I could see better) and stitch these together with the LIGHT using a scant 1/4" seam. This is exactly like a HST right now, but we are going to cut on BOTH diagonals to form two-coloured triangles.



These should be pressed toward the MEDIUM (or darker) fabric.

Using the squares that have $7/8$ ", we will take two (2) of each colour and set them aside. With the other eight (8) we will make HSTs exactly like we did in clue 2.

These HSTs should be pressed toward the darker fabric and trimmed to $4\frac{1}{2}$ ", $5\frac{1}{2}$ ", or $6\frac{1}{2}$ " now.

The four squares we set aside (2 of each fabric), we need to cut on ONE diagonal.

Using the triangles we just cut and the triangles we assembled on page 4, we will make four of each of these blocks:



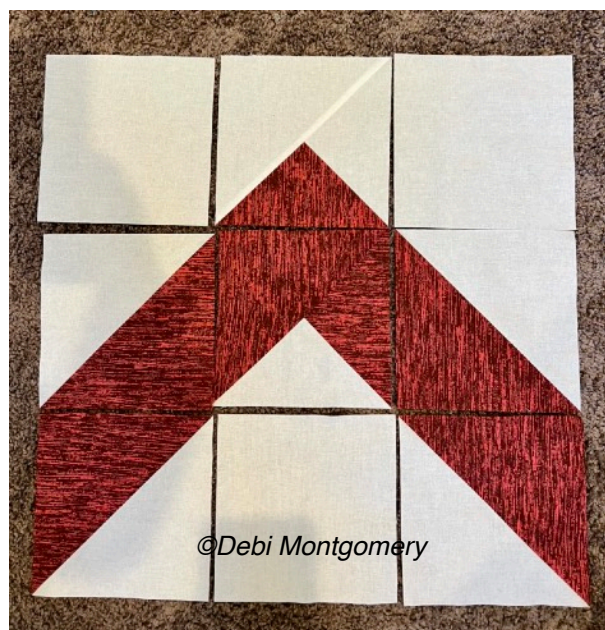
Four of each, pressed toward the single triangle and trimmed to $4\frac{1}{2}$ ", $5\frac{1}{2}$ " or $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Complete as below, these four blocks should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ ", $15\frac{1}{2}$ ", or $18\frac{1}{2}$ ".
