 Clue 2

We will have more larger cuts in this clue, with the remaining clues pretty “normal”. We will be assembling two more sets of blocks for this clue. We need FOUR of each set. We are breaking out that third fabric with this clue! Block A: flying geese units and Block B: 4-patch units... more easy blocks today. We will just get busy!

Block A:

BACKGROUND	<i>9” blocks</i>	<i>12” blocks</i>

<i>Cut squares on BOTH diagonals for triangles</i>	<i>4</i>

<i>Cut squares on BOTH diagonals for triangles</i>		<i>4</i>

CONTRAST	<i>9” blocks</i>	<i>12” blocks</i>
<i>10-1/4” WOF strips</i>	<i>1</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 10-1/4” squares</i>	<i>1</i>	
<i>Cut squares on BOTH diagonals for triangles</i>	<i>4</i>	
<i>AND 5-3/8” squares</i>	<i>4</i>	
<i>Cut these squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>	<i>8</i>	
<i>13-1/4” WOF strips</i>		<i>1</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 13-1/4” squares</i>		<i>1</i>
<i>Cut squares on BOTH diagonals for triangles</i>		<i>4</i>

CONTRAST	9" blocks	12" blocks
AND 6-7/8" squares		4
Cut these squares on ONE diagonal for triangles		8

ACCENT	9" blocks	12" blocks
5-3/8" WOF strips	1	
Sub-cut to 5-3/8" squares	4	
Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles	8	
6-7/8" WOF strips		1
Sub-cut to 6-7/8" squares		4
Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles		8

Are you ready for more easy blocks? We are going to be assembling some large flying geese blocks with these triangles. We will need to mate the BACKGROUND large triangles with the CONTRAST smaller triangles. We will mate the CONTRAST large triangles with the ACCENT smaller triangles.

Once we have the large flying geese units assembled, they should measure 5" x 9-1/2" OR 6-1/2" x 12-1/2" and be pressed away from that centre triangle.

Now let's assemble our block. Please make sure your CONTRAST touches itself to form a thick "arrow".



Once assembled, these units should be pressed toward the "top" of the block (to preserve that point). You will have FOUR of these 9-1/2" or 12-1/2" blocks now.



Block B: This chart is for **TWO** fabrics, please cut the specified amount from **EACH** fabric.

BACKGROUND and CONTRAST	9" blocks	12" blocks
5" WOF strips	1	
Sub-cut to 5" squares	8	
6-1/2" WOF strips		2
Sub-cut to 6-1/2" squares		8

These squares will be a 4-patch unit when we are finished. We will complete four of these units. Our completed units will measure 9-1/2" or 12-1/2". I started by stitching these together **BACKGROUND** to **CONTRAST**. Then stitched together opposite fabrics touching.
