 Clue 1

This is going to be a rather quick and easy project to get the blocks together. Let's just get started. PLEASE, remember this is a "sew along" and has NOT been tested by anyone. Please be patient as I am not at home while I am writing and the pics will be computer generated as I am not at my machine. I truly am missing stitching away though. I will catch up next week when I return.

For this clue, we will be assembling two sets of blocks, they are pretty easy and quick. Block A is a HST of sorts, we will assemble eight (8) of this block. Block B is pretty straight forward with squares and rectangles with us completing four (4) of these.

Block A:

FABRIC 1	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>9-7/8" WOF strips</i>	<i>1</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 9-7/8" squares</i>	<i>4</i>	
<i>Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>	<i>8</i>	
<i>2-5/8" WOF strips</i>	<i>3</i>	
<i>12-7/8" WOF strips</i>		<i>2</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 12-7/8" squares</i>		<i>4</i>
<i>Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>		<i>8</i>
<i>3-3/8" WOF strips</i>		<i>4</i>
FABRIC 2	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>3-7/8" WOF strips</i>	<i>1</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 3-7/8" squares</i>	<i>4</i>	
<i>Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>	<i>8</i>	

FABRIC 2	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>4-7/8" WOF strips</i>		<i>2</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 4-7/8" squares</i>		<i>4</i>
<i>Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>		<i>8</i>
FABRIC 3	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>2-5/8" WOF strips</i>	<i>3</i>	
<i>3-3/8" WOF strips</i>		<i>4</i>

We will make some strip-sets with FABRIC 1 and FABRIC 3 WOFs, please press these toward the darker of the two fabrics.



We will stitch our FABRIC 1 triangles to the FABRIC 3 side, you can fit two along each side for the 12". You may be able to fit three for the 9", if not, you'll need to cut another set of strips for the 9".



Then we will trim off the excess with it still "folded" (not pressed open). We need to do this to all eight triangles.





We should have something that looks like the pic at the left. We will use that final triangle (FABRIC 2) in that empty space at the top.



Complete, this should be pressed in the most flat manner and trimmed to measure 9-1/2" or 12-1/2" now. You should have eight of these.

Block B:

<i>Sub-cut to 4-1/2" squares</i>		<i>4</i>
<i>AND 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" units</i>		<i>4</i>
FABRIC 2	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>3-1/2" WOF strips</i>	<i>1</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" units</i>	<i>4</i>	
<i>AND 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" units</i>	<i>4</i>	
<i>4-1/2" WOF strips</i>		<i>1-2</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" units</i>		<i>4</i>
<i>AND 4-1/2" x 12-1/2" units</i>		<i>4</i>

FABRIC 3	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>3-1/2" WOF strips</i>	<i>1</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 3-1/2" squares</i>	<i>4</i>	
<i>4-1/2" WOF strips</i>		<i>1-2</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 4-1/2" squares</i>		<i>4</i>



Completely deconstructed, these are easy to stitch together. We need to have four of these. They should easily measure 9-1/2" or 12-1/2" once stitched and pressed. I press toward the largest single fabric. This makes my joins more flat.
