

Moot Point
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Clue 2

We have at least one more block with a rather large cut, so we will complete these. Since we need 12 of these, we will only do these in this clue. We will also cut our corner setting triangles to set aside with our setting triangles.

Corner triangles to set aside:

BACKGROUND	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>7-1/4" WOF strips</i>	<i>Scraps or 1</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 7-1/4" squares</i>	<i>2</i>	
<i>Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>	<i>4</i>	
<i>9-3/8" WOF strips</i>		<i>Scraps or 1</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 9-3/8" squares</i>		<i>2</i>
<i>Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>		<i>4</i>

*Block A: our only one for this clue, TWELVE of these. **PLEASE NOTE:** This chart is for TWO fabrics, please cut the specified amounts from EACH fabric.*

BACKGROUND and CONTRAST	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>10-1/4" WOF strips</i>	<i>1</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 10-1/4" squares</i>	<i>3</i>	
<i>Cut squares on BOTH diagonals for triangles</i>	<i>12</i>	
<i>5-3/8" WOF strips</i>	<i>Scraps +1 or 2</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 5-3/8" squares</i>	<i>12</i>	
<i>Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>	<i>24</i>	

BACKGROUND and CONTRAST	<i>9" blocks</i>	<i>12" blocks</i>
<i>13-1/4" WOF strips</i>		<i>1</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 13-1/4" squares</i>		<i>3</i>
<i>Cut squares on BOTH diagonals for triangles</i>		<i>12</i>
<i>6-7/8" WOF strips</i>		<i>Scraps +1 or 2</i>
<i>Sub-cut to 6-7/8" squares</i>		<i>12</i>
<i>Cut squares on ONE diagonal for triangles</i>		<i>24</i>

We will be assembling some large flying geese units, then using these to create chevrons. Here is our completely deconstructed block:

Please note we will be mating the BACKGROUND with the CONTRAST, and vice versa.

Your flying geese should measure 5" x 9-1/2" OR 6-1/2" x 12-1/2" now.



Making sure your CONTRAST is touching itself, stitch that centre seam to give us our 9-1/2" or 12-1/2" blocks. You should have TWELVE of these now.
