

Power House
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Intro and Requirements

This design is way too much fun and interesting to keep to myself! I am so excited to share with you. Power House is set on point with pieced setting triangles for fun! We are using colour to create movement and fun. Be brave and bold... I am loving this!

We will need three fabrics. These three fabrics MUST have heaps of contrast to each other for the “interest” to show through. Solids work, small to medium prints will work, even polka dots will work. To have maximum eye candy, I would probably use some pretty bright fabrics. I designed this in bright yellow, teal, and black if that helps... three completely different colours and fabrics. I will call them LIGHT, MEDIUM, and DARK to help. LIGHT should be bright, bold, solid, or small to medium print, doesn’t need to be in the background. It can be as loud as you wish. MEDIUM is where your colour shines through and forms a secondary pattern. This should be complementary to your LIGHT and DARK, but still tell its own story. The DARK should be very dark to finish off our story. This should be the polar opposite to the LIGHT and can also be solid, small to medium print. Remember the MEDIUM should also compliment and contrast the DARK. Contrast is the key to a beautiful finish.

We will use the “tri-recs tool” or similar triangle in a square template. I am offering two sizes (9” and 10” blocks) for this rectangle design. You could make it a square by adding a couple rows, but please make sure you have plenty extra fabric to accommodate.

MEDIUM	1-1/2 yards	1-3/4 yards
DARK*	4-1/2 yards	5 yards
